WIRKSWORTH TOWN COUNCIL

Notes of a Meeting of the Environment & Town Working Party held 5 July 2021

Following the government's decision to revoke the Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020 on 7th May 2021, the council has decided it is not safe to meet face to face. As it is not able to meet using virtual platforms (e.g. Zoom) it is also unable to discharge its obligation under Open and Accountable Government to ensure transparency by providing public participation. The council has therefore agreed to continue meeting but in the form of a working party.

The working party meeting will be held to the same standard as a committee but any decision taken at a working party meeting does not constitute a lawful decision of council - the Council has delegated all decisions to Chair of Council, Deputy Chair and Chairs of Environment & Town and Finance, Buildings & Personnel Committees (4 Councillors) and the Clerk - Resolution C20/180 26/4/2021

All delegated decisions will be reported in line with guidelines for Open and Accountable Government (Openness of Local Government Bodies 2014).

The Town Council would make the following comments: We understand that in the past, planning applications have restricted the scale of development on				

this site and ask the following issues to be addressed.

The proposed development would significantly increase the size of this dwelling, which will create issues with overlooking and privacy for adjacent properties. Removal of trees will also reduce the current screening, exacerbated by the height of the development.

It is understood from local residents that the adjacent cliff face serves to reflect sound and therefore the development may result in unintended noise nuisance to neighbouring properties (the presence of an elevated games room with raised outside space may also contribute to this issue)

Access to the site is via a former farm track, and we note that the development provides for substantial car parking.

The area below the site already experiences issue with runoff/ drainage concerns, the potential tarmacking of the access road (and/or future widening) combined with the increased footprint of this development will lead to greater issues with water drainage.

It is noted that the current access is not adequate for standard size refuse collection vehicles.

The plan provides for a separate studio with connected services, no specific reference is made to this within the D&A Statement and there is concern that this may be used for business purposes resulting in increased traffic.

ET21/32 Community Recovery Fund

Steph Walsh introduced herself as the officer DCC has assigned to Wirksworth for the bid.

The application by DCC has now been shortlisted by the government. Each of the 6 towns within the Derbyshire bid now need to prepare statements for their town identifying the core elements required within the regeneration project. The first step in this process is to identify a lead person for Wirksworth who will take this forward. It will also be necessary to identify and liaise with the organisations in the town as well as ensuring all residents and businesses are aware of the project.

REC that the Town Clerk be nominated as the lead person on the project supported by Councillors (lead by Cllr Jordan and Cllr Clamp). It was noted that the Clerk's work pattern excludes Fridays and that Councillors will attend meeting on these days. The council now need to liaise with local groups including NOW, Festival, Heritage Centre, EVR, Ecocentre, Stone Centre and Mount Cook. DCC are preparing a draft press release and this will be used as the basis of any communication to residents (via social media given the timescales). That the clerk circulates the DCC priorities spreadsheet to all councilors to seek feedback and return back to DCC by 8/7/21.

ET21/33 Yokecliffe Play Area

District Councillors have provided a written update on the management policy of this space especially in regard to rewilding and expressed a wish to engage with the Town Council.

REC that the matter be deferred and that District Councillors be invited to speak at a future meeting to discuss the District Councils approach to rewilding.

Councillors observed that they felt that rewilding needs more management; that confirmation should be sought from any

proposed scheme of the proposed specification and ongoing maintenance plan.

ET21/34 Raven Sculpture

A resident has proposed the installation of a Raven Sculpture on one of the Street Lamps on Church Walk. Derbyshire CC will only allow the installation to proceed if the licence application is made by the Town Council (and TC take responsibility for sculpture). The installation would then be insured by the Town Council but would require annual safety inspections to comply with terms of the TC Insurance policy.

REC that the council postponed any decision on this matter in order to determine the Town Council's broader policy; as this issue will create a perpetual future responsibility for maintenance and monitoring as well as setting a precedent for further requests.

That the clerk prepare a short list of potential design partners for agreement in September. The shortlisted parties would the be subject to a selection process including seeking outline plan for the space based upon the 2nd stage consultation results.
