C20/119 Open Forum:

WCRG provided an update on activities since the summer, they received 20 calls in Nov/Dec (during second Lockdown primarily requests for assistance to attend medical appointments but are now co-ordinating with Hannage Brook Surgery to assist with transport for people unable to get to Ashbourne for C19 vaccinations). A request for funding has been referred for more detailed discussion at a later meeting.

C20/120 Right of Way/Footpaths (attached)

Referred from Full Council to determine next steps in regards to establishing PROW for footpaths at Summer Lane, Bent Lane and Old Lane, originally identified in 2018.

In addition, the Climate Emergency Working Parting have met and discussed wider issues around footpaths and Rights of Way, recommendation and next steps identified in attached meeting notes.

RESOLVED that the working party continue to investigate the matter and report to Environment and Town with recommendations regarding footpaths and related matters.

C20/121 New National Lockdown

To consider whether the council need to revise or review current procedures following the introduction of the latest government measures to mitigate the spread of C19.

RESOLVED that the provision of services outlined by the Clerk remain unchanged, unless amendments are required in order to comply with government guidelines/ legislation.

Office staff to work from home with immediate effect, any attendance at Town Hall to be minimised.

Caretakers continue to undertake all the routine checks, maintenance and cleaning of the various buildings and assets. Generally, they will try to work alone.

Barmote Toilets to remain open.

Tuesday Market to continue -stall holders restricted to those providing essentials.

Leasehold Tenants- as with first lockdown, tenants continue to have the right of access to their spaces. We therefore have to ensure toilets and communal areas are cleaned appropriately.

Play Areas to remain open.

Stoney Wood -as an open space it remains accessible.

Fanny Shaw's Community Building remains closed.

As a new measure, staff have been asked to wear face coverings when they are out and about working (this is not a govt requirement yet). Staff already wear face coverings when moving within the buildings.

C20/122 Meeting Schedule

To consider whether any further changes are required to the existing schedule of meetings during lock down.

RESOLVED that the existing meeting pattern of 2 committees followed by full council continues each month.

C20/123 Farmers Market

To consider whether the Town Council continue to allow a letting of the space adjacent to the Memorial Hall by NOW for the Farmers Market. *At present, markets selling essential goods may continue to operate, there is no specific exclusion of 'Farmers Markets' from this rule.*

RESOLVED that the council continue to let space to allow the market to operate. That the organiser be asked to (at least) match the measures in place for the Town Council- operated Tuesday Market, such as mandatory masks for stewards and stall holders.

C20/124 Festival

To consider whether to agree a concessionary let of the Town and Memorial Halls in September 2021. Provision for a grant of \pounds 500 has been made in the 2021/22 budget. For Festival in 2019, the council agreed a grant of \pounds 1000 and a concessionary let of 10 days from 6/9/19 - 15/9/19 with a value of \pounds 4500.00.

RESOLVED that in principle agreement be given for a concessionary let with the same terms as 2019.

The remaining items originally formed part of the Environment & Town Committee agenda prior to the meeting being changed to a full council meeting.

C20/125 Kingsfield Trees (attached)

Request from resident to cut back the trees surrounding the Play Area.

RESOLVED that the Clerk contact the Tree Officer at DCC/DDDC for an opinion regarding the request and report back to committee with findings.

C20/126 Claims to add Restricted Byways at Gorsey Bank – Wirksworth

Comments are sought by DCC on two applications for Orders to be made to add rights of way on the Definitive Map and Statement for Derbyshire (ref 77427 & 77299).

RESOLVED that should raise no objections to the orders.

C20/127 Car Park – Coldwell St

Request from resident to consider steps necessary to secure the site opposite the railway to allow for the provision of additional car parking for the town.

RESOLVED that the matter be referred to E&T on 1 February for further discussion in light of the recent planning application. Cllr Gratton to investigate whether an approximate valuation of the site might be obtained, to inform discussion regarding the feasibility of the site being used as a car park.

C20/128 Raven Sculpture (attached)

A resident has requested the Town Council's comments (and support) for their request to install a sculpture on a lamp post on church walk.

RESOLVED that the council offer (non-financial) support to the proposal.

C20/129 Review of Neighbourhood Plan

To consider how to update and revise the plan, originally prepared and adopted in 2015.

RESOLVED that Cllr Jordan lead a Working Party comprised of Cllrs Casselden, Clamp, Stockell and Whittall (5 members), with the objective of reviewing the existing plan - the adoption of a new Local Plan by DDDC and the proposals for housing at Middle Peak represent a material change to circumstances under which the original plan was drawn. The group to seek to re-engage with former members of the original group who prepared the plan, to seek sources of funding for the work, e.g. DDDC and to seek guidance from external sources such as NALC and DALC. The group to report to Environment and Town Committee with recommendations.

C20/130 Lamp Post Poppies (attached)

A complaint has been received from a resident regarding the absence of these poppies during the period around Remembrance Sunday/Armistice Day.

RESOLVED that the Clerk respond back on behalf of the council to address the complaint and to outline the council's actions in supporting Remembrance within Wirksworth.

C20/131 Memorial Bench

Request from a resident for an additional memorial bench to be installed in the area adjacent to the War Memorial.

RESOLVED that the Clerk respond back to explain that whilst the approach and offer of support is greatly appreciated, the design of the space was undertaken by urban landscape architects with the final design selected following public consultation. The design was carefully created to draw the visitors sight lines towards the 'Lest We Forget' Gates and it is felt that further installations would detract from this aesthetic.
