ET23/28 Minutes: the Minutes of the Meeting of the Environment and Town Committee held on 5 June 2023 were confirmed as a correct record.

ET23/29 Affordable Housing

Shelter is requesting local councils write to the Secretary of State for housing to support an amendment to the Levelling Up Bill that could reduce the cost of building social homes by 40%.

REC that the council write to S Dines MP and M Gove MP as requested by Shelter. That the council write to DDDC and DCC to draw their attention to the matter and advising that the Town Council has written to both the Minister and constituency MP.

ET23/30 Representation and collaboration with National Stone Centre and Tarmac

Proposal to allocate a representative from the Council to work with both entities to facilitate closer working.

REC that the council invite IoQ to meet the new council and provide an update. To invite all councillors to the meeting and to be held in August if IoQ have availability.

The Town Council to invite Tarmac to meet the new council to provide an overview of potential developments in the town to inform the Neighbourhood Plan

ET23/31 Footpath Warden

To appoint a Footpath Warden for Wirksworth. This position would be voluntary and might follow the process utilised in Northamptonshire.

REC that the Clerk prepare and advertise a voluntary post of Footpath Warden on the same basis as used in Northamptonshire.

A resident has raised concerns that the S215 notice has not been fully actioned. Resolution ET23/7 "..that the Council write to advise DDDC that the work has commenced on condition 1 of the S215 notice, requesting that the planning authority continue to monitor the matter to ensure the works are concluded given the late start to the works.."

REC that the Town Council contact D Cllr P Slack to advise that "in the Town Council's opinion the terms set out in the enforcement notice have not been complied with and would therefore ask that the matter be revisited by the planning authority as the concerns raise by residents and Town Council remain."
