Open Forum opened 6:35pm

ET23/95 Open Forum:

A resident spoke about flooding issues around the Hannages (they had been present at a site meeting with C Cllr Murphy, Cllr Pollock and Cllr Maskrey that morning). The resident has met with Derbyshire Wildlife Trust to discuss potential mitigation measures (Trickle Dams) to the feeder brooks into the Ecclesbourne, but DWT aren't able to progress this at present due to funding constraints. The resident reported that there are more frequent surges from STW manholes. They have previously met with ST and was informed that there was a medium term plan. Manhole discharge is not "normal" behaviour and should be on a management plan to reduce these events. Flooding from the brook is now more regularly spreading across Brooklands avenue.

Another resident raised the more frequent occurrence of flooding at Millers Green impact areas such as Speedwell Mill.

Open Forum closed 6:45pm

ET23/96 Minutes: the Minutes of the Meeting of the Environment and Town Committee held on 4 December 2023 were confirmed as a correct record.

ET23/97 Harrison Drive Drainage Resident reports that in early December a number of people have fallen on Harrison Drive due to ice across the pavement (created by the overflow from the gulley).

REC that matter be raised with C CIIr Murphy given the danger this poses to pedestrians.

ET23/98 Brooklands Avenue/Water Lane Flooding

Incidents of flooding have increased, often resulting in restricted access/no access to Gorsey Bank due to flood waters (on 8/1/24 there was a site meeting with C Cllr Murphy, Cllr Pollock, Cllr Maskrey and a resident).

A balancing pond will be created on Gell land, the contractor has been selected, but works are awaiting the issue of a licence from DCC.

REC that the Council contact C Cllr Muphy requesting:

- That the issue of the licence for the balancing pond works be chased up.
- Erosion of the road to be flagged with Highways
- Request that a level line be placed on either side of the road to indicate height of flood waters
- That a process be established to close the road in the event of flood waters blocking the highway

ET23/99 Wirksworth Drains, Mains and Sewers

Proposal to form a small sub-group/working party that focusses on lobbying/engaging with the different parties to address the issues faced in the town, and potential issues in the future – with DCC, Anthony Gell, Severn Trent, Developers. With an initial focus on the recent flooding. Matter referred from Full Council for more detailed discussion by E&T Committee – with a strong recommendation that the issue of part of Wirksworth (Gorsey Bank) being cut-off by flood waters requires escalation.

REC that initial focus is on the issues at Waterlane. Once the balancing pond has been installed and the impact on flooding established, the council to then focus on other areas identified in the Drains, Mains and Sewers document.

ET23/100 DCC Greener Towns 20mph Consultation - Outcomes and Decision

"It was always the intention of the Council to listen to the voice of those affected; for the proposals to continue we required a majority from residents as well as positive feedback from the Districts, neither of which was achieved. Subsequently it was recommended to Cabinet that the schemes should not progress. Cabinet then debated this on 7th December and took the decision not to proceed with the schemes; the decision can be found here: https://democracy.derbyshire.gov.uk/ieDecisionDetails.aspx?AlId=14251

REC that matter be noted.

ET23/101 Safer Roads for Wirksworth

The group have requested the following support from the Town Council:

- request to follow up missing Belisha beacon on St Johns St (outside Hope and Anchor) with Highways

- support letters to local bus companies to voluntarily reduce speed driving through town

- support letters to local haulage companies and Longcliffe to review their routes, whether driving through Wirksworth is absolutely necessary and to reduce speed

- to support the public consultation planned for early February 2024.

REC that the Town Council contact C Cllr Murphy seeking action to replace the missing beacon. To note that the letters by the group wait until the consultation has been undertaken to give more evidence/ weight to the requests. That the public consultation by the group is likely to commence from March.

ET23/102 TrailTale

The company have contacted the council regarding their solution ("which they have collaborated with numerous local authorities") to develop self-guided heritage and nature walk routes, which uses their free mobile phone app – TrailTale.

REC that the Town Council note the matter. That the information be passed to Heritage Centre and NOW.

ET23/103 Snowball

Snowball is a free review platform, described by the app creators as a "TripAdvisor for the disabled community". The creators have written to the Council requesting that the app (Snowball) be discussed with a further request that the Town Council then "promote Snowball in your area and get the community involved, including local businesses but also, if possible, review your area so that we can help one another create an equal and inclusive community."

REC that the Town Council note the matter. That the information be passed to Heritage Centre and NOW.
