Project Update

Happily the public rights of way across The Meadows will reopen on 1 March. This does not include the new footpaths which have been created at the centre of the site. These paths will be remain closed for now, to give them further time to settle and to provide a safe perimeter between pedestrians and the contractors, as they continue to work in the area which will become the community lawn.

Wildscapes will be on site intermittently in March, in order to complete the second phase of works. This includes completing the gabion benches and amphitheatre, and signage installation.

The meadow and lawn areas have now been fenced off until they are established. While the community lawn will be opened as soon as possible, it can take several years of careful management to transform an area of scrub and dominant grass into a wildflower meadow, so we ask residents to keep the faith and not to be too disappointed in the first 12 months! Careful maintenance helps a meadow to develop year on year. The council hopes that the meadow and lawn will ultimately be wonderful assets to the community and ask that residents (and their dogs) please keep to the Rights of Way and avoid accessing these areas for now, to avoid disrupting germination by trampling the seed.
